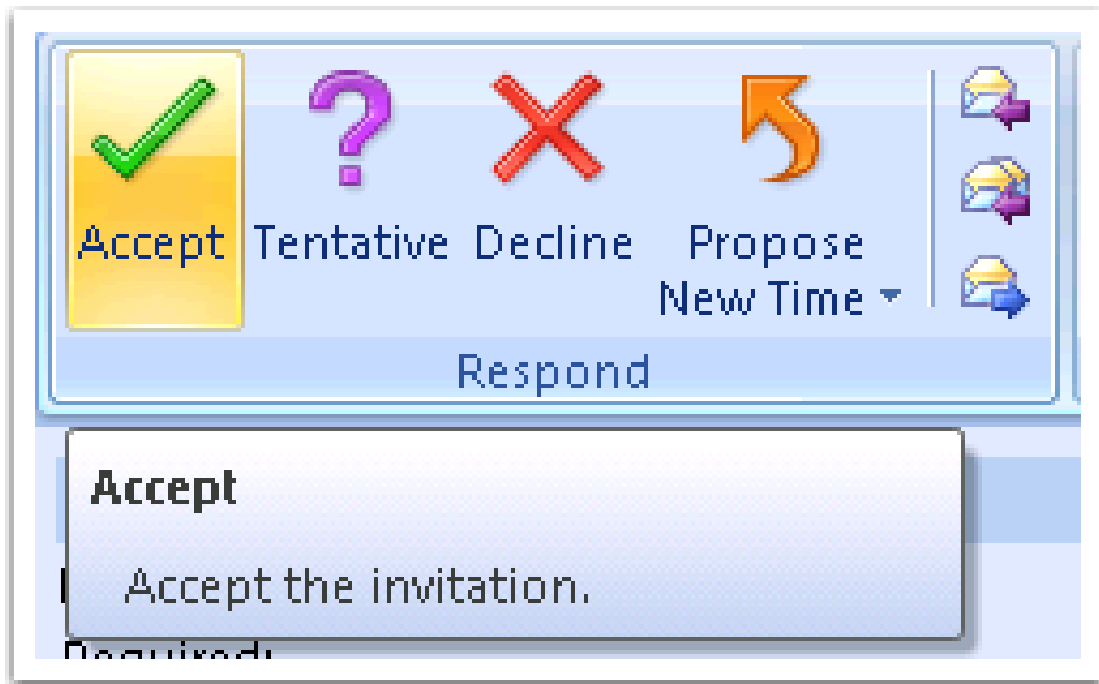

Data pulled out are only as good as data put in.

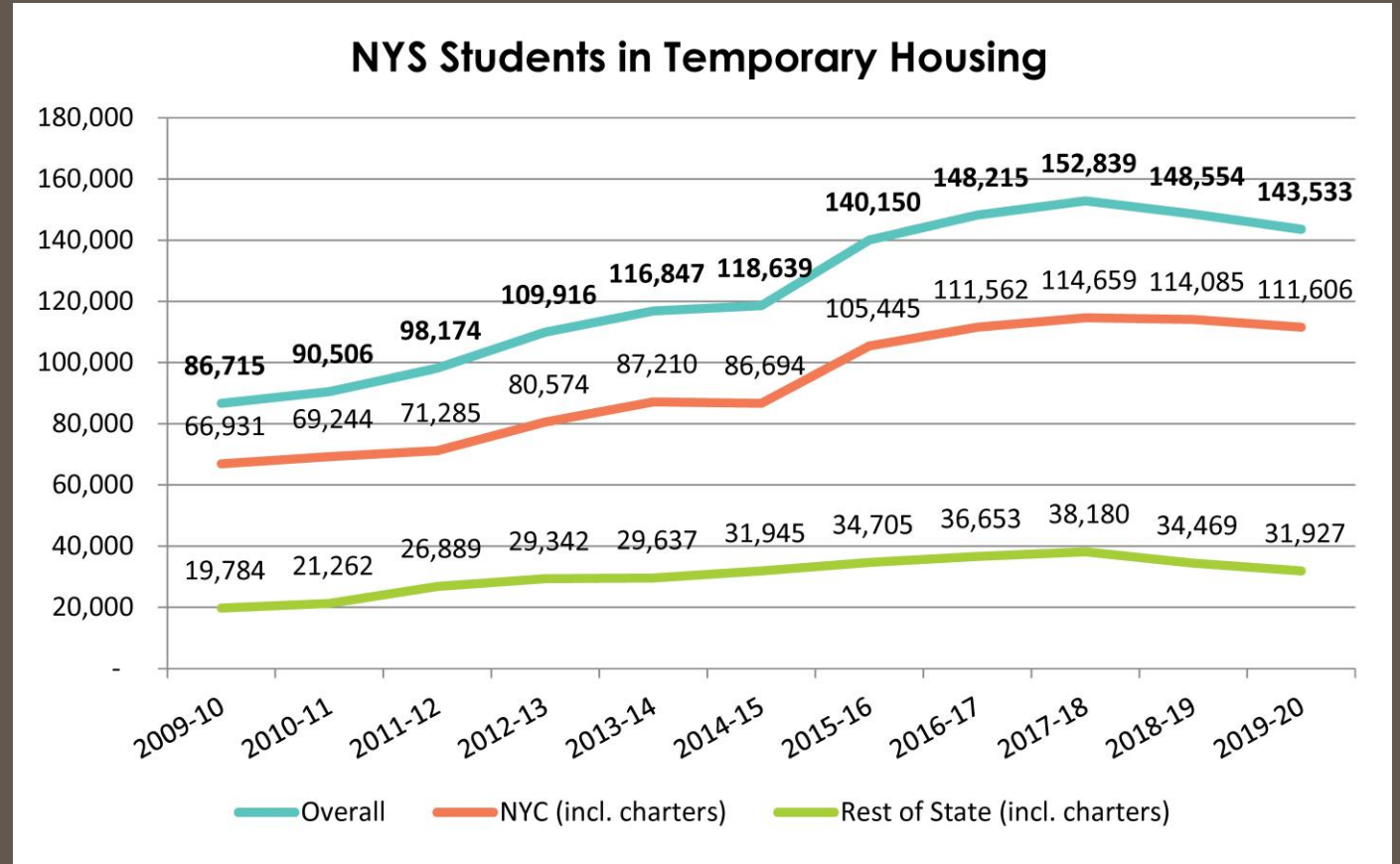


Meet with your district's Data Coordinator to talk about:

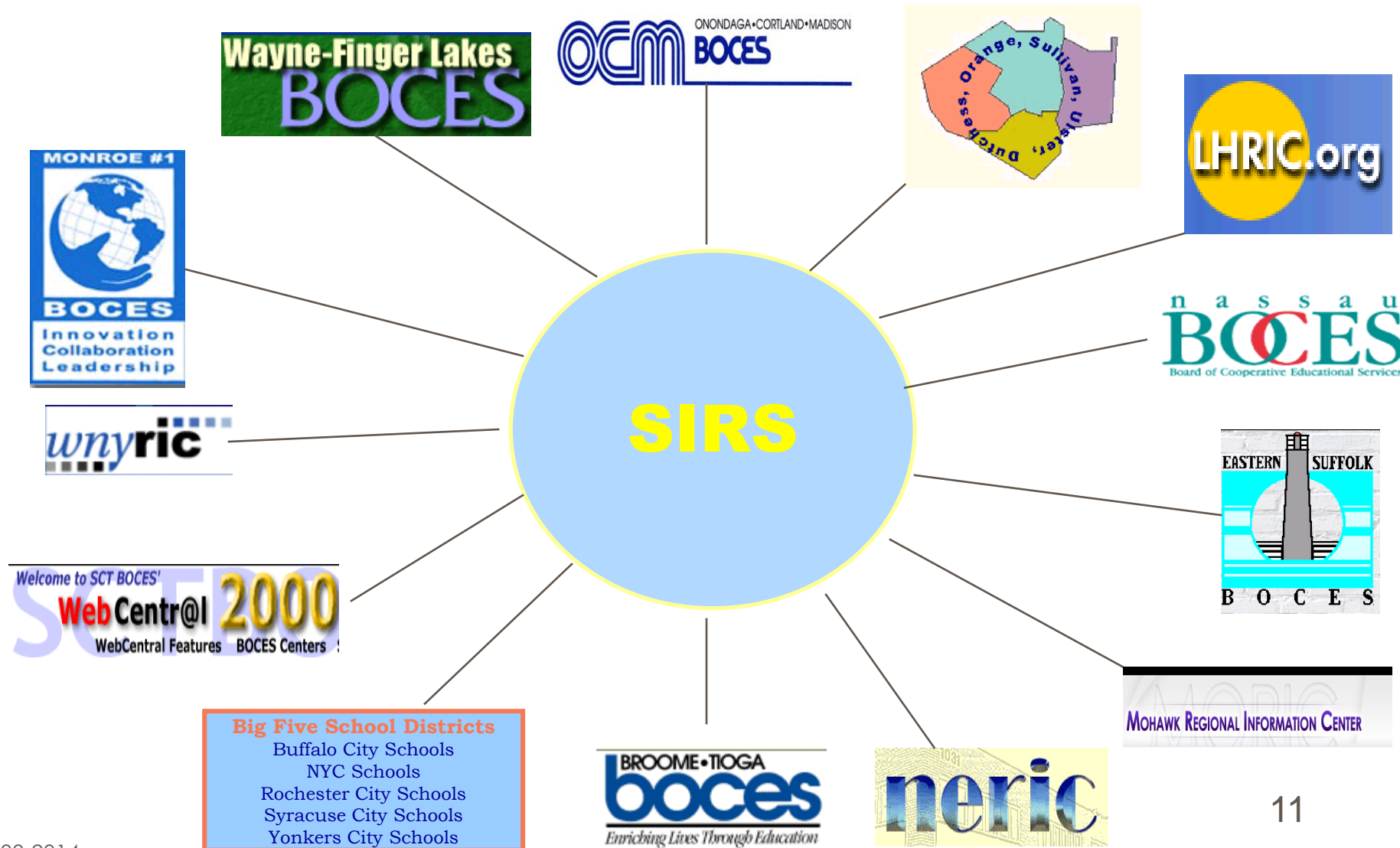

SIRS Codes Needed for ALL Students Experiencing Homelessness

Program Service Code 8262 - Homeless Student Status

- Entry Date: Date student became homeless
- Exit Date: Date student became permanently housed and is no longer homeless

Homeless Primary Nighttime Residence

- Programs_Fact Table, Field 23
- **S** = Shelters **T** = Transitional Housing
- **H** = Hotels/motels **D** = Doubled-up (with another family)
- **U** = Unsheltered (car, parks, campgrounds, temporary trailer, or abandoned buildings)

SIRS Codes Needed for *Some* Students Experiencing Homelessness

Title I Part A: Homeless Student Served with Set- Aside Funds

- **Program Service Code 0892**
- Homeless students should receive code if they received services paid for with Title I, Part A set-aside funds

Unaccompanied Youth Status

- **Program Service Code 8272**
- Not in the physical custody of a parent or legal guardian
- Homeless under McKinney-Vento

Data Verification in SIRS

How does a district verify that homeless data are correct?

L2RPT (Level 2 Report) is the State Education Department's verification reporting system

○ Reasonableness Report

- Shows counts of students reported for programs, demographics, enrollment for two years with **difference** and **rate change** to help districts identify reporting errors.
- Homeless status appears under *Programs* category; Primary Nighttime Residence appears under *Demographic* category.
- Homeless Unaccompanied Youth status appears under *Programs* category.
- **BEDS Day Enrollment Report** shows indicator for students reported with homeless flag on student detail report.

A Reasonableness Report is a data density or "red flag" report. The purpose of the report is to identify significant changes in data (column C), and the percent change between those counts (column D) of students by various category types (i.e., enrollment error).

Particular attention should be paid to percent changes equal to or greater than 10 and reporting issues known to have caused data errors may be significant. Reporting issues known to cause difficulties include the failure to report students eligible to take the NYSESLT, the failure to report enrollment code and diploma code for graduates, and the failure to ensure that ELL students and students with disabilities are correctly reported.

For each report, a student is counted only once within a code. If a student is reported with multiple codes, the student is counted only once.

Timeline for Data Reporting

Timeline is approximate and subject to change.

Spring

Verification reports of data reported through SIRS available through L2RPT. Grantee Reports due **June 30, 2021**.

Summer

Data warehouse closes **August 20, 2021**. No changes to 2020-21 school year records will be accepted after the deadline.

Fall

SED sends initial data to US Department of Education. NYS-TEACHS publishes homeless enrollment data.

Review: Data Reporting in SIRS

- Data on students experiencing homelessness are collected in the **Student Information Repository System (SIRS)**
- **All students experiencing homelessness** must receive **Program Service Code 8262** and a **Primary Nighttime Residence Code**.
- **Unaccompanied Youth** should receive **Program Service Code 8272**.
- Students served with **Title I, Part A set-asides** should receive **Program Service Code 0892**.
- **Level 2 reports** should be run to ensure data accuracy.

Next Steps

- **Review data entry procedures** with Data Coordinator, Pupil Accounting personnel, and other relevant staff;
- **Periodically review and update student data** as students move in/out of temporary housing and receive services paid for with Title I, Part A set-aside funds.
- **Run Level 2 reports** to ensure data accuracy before close of the data warehouse over the summer.

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
