NEW McKinney-Vento Initiative

Goals:

- Provide technical assistance to BOCES to support students and families from component districts experiencing temporary housing.
- Offer opportunities to connect with key BOCES staff to support the sharing of ideas and building knowledge around students in transitional housing.





Overview of the McKinney-Vento Initiative

Develop an infrastructure to support BOCES and their component school districts to implement the McKinney-Vento Act and to support the academic achievement of students in temporary housing.

Targeted Assistance to support McKinney-Vento liaisons through two structures:

- Statewide BOCES Meetings (two per school year)
- Targeted Regional meetings (Three sessions per region)





Statewide BOCES Meetings

Audience: BOCES District Superintendents, McKinney-Vento liaisons, related staff

Structure: Large group meetings, twice a school year

Purpose:

- Share McKinney-Vento resources
- Provide information on Regional trainings
- Facilitate connections among BOCES McKinney-Vento liaisons





Targeted Regional BOCES Meetings

Audience: BOCES McKinney-Vento liaisons or related staff and McKinney-Vento liaisons from component LEAs

Structure: Regional meetings, three (3) times in a school year. Breakout room discussions facilitated by BOCES liaison.

Purpose:

- Share McKinney-Vento resources.
- Facilitate connections among McKinney-Vento liaisons in each region.
- Provide opportunities for discussions focused on identification, barriers to enrollment, and the unique needs of students in temporary housing in that region.

LEA McKinney-Vento Requirements

The McKinney-Vento Act requires every LEA, including BOCES and charter schools to designate a local liaison to assist families and district staff with the identification and enrollment of students experiencing temporary housing.

McKinney-Vento Liaison Responsibilities

NYSED Memo: <u>LEA Policy on the Education of Students in</u> <u>Temporary Housing</u>

All local educational agencies (LEAs), which include school districts, charter schools, and BOCES, must review and revise policies to improve the identification, enrollment, attendance, and success in schools of students in temporary housing.

- 6. Posting Public Notice
- 7. Dispute Resolution
- 8. Transportation
- 9. Training for Colleagues
- 10. Meeting the Needs of Unaccompanied Youth
